

Contents of EB Neonatal Box

	Products	Purpose
1	Mepitel One (1 sheet)	To apply underneath ECG leads, to protect skin – if monitoring is required
2	Mepitel 10cm x 18cm (1 sheet)	Primary dressing /contact layer dressing
3	Urgotul 15cm x 20 cm (1 sheet)	Primary dressings / contact layer
4	Mepilex & Mepilex Lite 15cm x 15cm (3 sheets)	Primary or secondary dressing
5	Mepilex Transfer 10cm x 12 cm (1 sheet)	Exudate transfer dressing/ or dressing for fingernail beds
6	Mepiform (1 strip)	Securing tape or skin protection for NGT/ETT
7	Mepitac Tape (2cm x 3m)	For securing devices and dressings
8	Mepitel Film	Securing tape for IV Cannula
9	Tubifast (green & red)	Securing tubular bandage
10	Intrasite conformable 10 x 10 cm (2 sheets)	For nappy area
11	Polymem Non-Adhesive roll 10 x 60cm (2 rolls)	Primary dressing
12	Hypafix tape (only to secure to the Polymem NOT for use on skin) – 1 roll	To secure Polymem to itself
13	Niltac spray (SMAR – Silicone medical adhesive remover)	To gently remove anything that is stuck to the skin to prevent further damage
14	Glad wrap	To cover wounds while preparing dressings to prevent air reaching wounds and causing pain
15	Cornflour	To dry out blisters once lanced and drained. Not to apply on open wounds
16	Pigeon Cleft Palate Feeding Bottle and teats	May be needed if having trouble establishing a suck with breast feeding. Less chance of oral trauma/blister formation, soft silicone teat and easy flow
17	Handle with care stickers	To alert those coming into contact with the baby
18	“The newborn with suspected EB” leaflet	Information for the parents
19	Mission Statement of National EB Neonatal Boxes (includes contact details of centres of expertise and the website for accurate biopsy sampling information)	For the staff
20	National EB Dressings Scheme application form	For the staff to begin the application process (all babies get provisional approval subject to proof of diagnosis). Must be registered with Medicare.
21	“How to handle me” picture	Diagram to demonstrate how to handle baby safely
22	Recommended Care Information	Information on principles of care for neonates with suspected EB
